Viewer Guide

Our God is a God of abundance.

Yahweh was offering the children of Israel satisfaction in their lives.

John 10:10, “The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”

Of all the Jews who had the chance to experience the promised land, only two took God up on His offer.

Israel had been in captivity in Egypt approximately 400 years.

There must be deliverance to even begin the journey.

Just like Israel, we need to be delivered from:

a. A person

b. A place

Israel needed deliverance from Pharaoh; we need deliverance from Satan.

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In the Old Testament, the deliverer was Moses. In the New Testament, the deliverer is Jesus Christ.

The only way to have a relationship with God is through His Son, Jesus Christ.

Each of us must decide if we want to go where God is leading.

In order to get milk and honey, the Israelites had to walk away from the place where Pharaoh ruled.

Galatians 5:1, “It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery.”

Two questions:

1. Have you been freed from the person of the Enemy in your life?
2. Have you been freed from the places where the Enemy reigns?



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Session 2

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Exodus 13:17

“Now when Pharaoh had let the people go, God did not lead them by the way of the land of the Philistines, even though it was near; for God said, ‘The people might change their minds when they see war, and return to Egypt.’”

God chose the wilderness for the people of Israel.

There are some things we don't know about ourselves until we are put in a position where we have to see God's power working through us.

God will comfort us by His Holy Spirit. Trust Him with the wilderness.

God wants to develop us, and He uses the wilderness to do it.

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Job 42:5
**“I have heard of You by the hearing of the ear;
But now my eye sees You.”**

You can't see miracles unless there is an *impossible*
situation you can't figure out for yourself.



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Session 3

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God is predictable in His *character*, but He is completely unpredictable in His *activity*.

We have to let God be God when it comes to how He wants to *govern* our lives.

Your victory is *guaranteed* in Scripture.

Moses said four things:

Be *fearless*.

Be *still*.

Be *watchful*.

Be *silent*.

The same God who worked on our behalf *yesterday* is the same God who can work on our behalf *today*.

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Psalm 46:10

“Cease striving and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth.”

Standing and stillness are _____ *prerequisites* _____ for watchfulness.

Abundant life, promised land living is not for _____ *tomorrow* _____ —it is for today—watch for it.

_____ *Train* _____ yourself to be quiet. Train yourself not to open your mouth in arrogance or complaining.



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Session 4

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Our responsibility is not to figure out or fix the wilderness. Our responsibility is to yield to the wilderness.

Exodus 13:17-18

“Now when Pharaoh had let the people go, God did not lead them by the way of the land of the Philistines, even though it was near; for God said, ‘The people might change their minds when they see war, and return to Egypt.’ Hence God led the people around by the way of the wilderness to the Red Sea; and the sons of Israel went up in martial array from the land of Egypt.”

“Therefore”

The “therefore” is the connecting link between the hugeness of our sin and the far greater enormity of His love for us in spite of that sin.

The wilderness reveals to us:

1. The passion of God

Hosea 2:14

**“Therefore, behold, I will allure her,
Bring her into the wilderness
And speak kindly to her.”**

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Allure: to entice by charm; to attract

Romans 8:18

“For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us.”

Intimacy with us is God’s goal.

2. The power of God

3. The purpose of God

The same Yahweh who was willing to pay a price for His beloved people in the Old Testament is the same God who loved us so much He was willing to pay a great, high price in the New Testament.

He was willing to send His only begotten Son to die on the cross of Calvary.



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Session 5

Viewer Guide

You can't do what you've always done and
expect different results.

If we want to move on to promised land living, we have to start doing things differently.

John 10:10

**“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy;
I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”**

The only two who made the trip to the promised land were
Joshua and Caleb.

They were willing to do things differently.

For 38 years they traveled in a circle around
Kadesh-barnea.

The wilderness is not a barrier to the promised land;
wandering in the wilderness is the barrier to the promised land.

Kadesh-Barnea was an oasis, the oasis of
complacency.

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You know you are in the oasis of complacency when:

1. The promised land starts looking way too risky.
2. You start feeling like you have arrived.
3. The Enemy stops trying to hinder your progress.

“Nevertheless”

The people saw and still chose not to believe.

Numbers 13:23

“Then they came to the valley of Eshcol and from there cut down a branch with a single cluster of grapes; and they carried it on a pole between two men, with some of the pomegranates and the figs.”

The spies had proof of God’s ability, a “cluster” of proof.

What kind of influencers do you have in your life?

What kind of influencer are you?

Romans 8:19, “The anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God.”



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Session 6

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Moses had to die before Joshua could become leader.

The time for mourning does come to an end— get over it.

Joshua 3:1

“Then Joshua rose early in the morning; and he and all the sons of Israel set out from Shittim and came to the Jordan, and they lodged there before they crossed.”

1. Joshua acted immediately in obedience to God.

The land of promise is often lost by lingering or procrastinating.

What do we miss because we don't obey immediately?

2. Joshua acted fearlessly, in spite of insurmountable odds.

Joshua 3:1-2

“Then Joshua rose early in the morning; and he and all the sons of Israel set out from Shittim and came to the Jordan, and they lodged there before they crossed. At the end of three days the officers went through the midst of the camp.”

Joshua took God at His word.

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God doesn't call people because they are equipped. He equips them because He's called them.

The area of sensitivity and tenderness in your life is probably the area where God wants you to experience the most victory, where He wants the biggest ministry to come from your life.

God doesn't call us to do the possible. He calls us to do the impossible and then He equips us to handle it.

3. Joshua acknowledged the presence of God.

Joshua 3:3

“They commanded the people, saying, ‘When you see the ark of the covenant of the LORD your God with the Levitical priests carrying it, then you shall set out from your place and go after it.’”

John 5:19

“Jesus answered and was saying to them, ‘Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, unless it is something He sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, these things the Son also does in like manner.’”

Joshua 3:5

“Then Joshua said to the people, ‘Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do wonders among you.’”

4. Joshua anticipated God's miracles all around him.

Start living today like God has already performed the biggest miracle of your life.



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
