CONTEXT AND COMMENTARY FOR PERSONAL STUDY AND PREPARATION

(For age-appropriate language, use the Bible story on the following page.)

Exodus opens with an ominous verse that immediately provokes dread in any reader who knows what is coming next. “A new king, who did not know about Joseph, came to power in Egypt.” (Exodus 1:8) Joseph’s family had come to Egypt by invitation and under the protection of a previous pharaoh. Pharaoh gave them lush, fertile land in which to raise their livestock. (Genesis 47) Jacob’s sons and their families initially flourished in Egypt. But this was not the land God had promised to Abraham’s descendants. (Genesis 12) They were never meant to stay there forever.

Forever is what it must have felt like when the Israelites still lived in Egypt over 400 years later. Because God had blessed them and multiplied them so abundantly, over time their presence in the land became a threat to the new king. Though they were once guests, the Israelites became slaves and were treated inhumanely. (Exodus 1:9-14)

With ever-increasing cruelty, Pharaoh commanded that all Hebrew baby boys must be drowned in the Nile. In an act of courage, one Israelite mother, Jochebed, put her baby in the hands of God by placing him in a papyrus basket and setting him among the reeds by the river. By God’s providence, Pharaoh’s daughter discovered the baby and felt sorry for him.

The baby’s sister was nearby watching the events unfold. Her combination of quick wit and supernatural boldness allowed her to approach Pharaoh’s daughter with what she posed as an innocent suggestion. Her daring plan allowed her baby brother not only to live but also to live at home with his mother. How Jochebed’s mourning must have turned to dancing when she realized what the Lord had done for her!

God heard the cries of His people. God remembered the promise He made to bring them into the land that He would give them. At just the right time, God raised up the person He chose to lead the Israelites to freedom. No act of Pharaoh, no act of man, and no act of the darkest spiritual forces could stop God.

What are you trusting God for today? As you pray this week, ask God to remind you that He is sovereign over all things. Ask Him for the faith to believe that He is in control and can do anything.



GROUP TIME

- **Move to group time.** Whisper to each child: “God can do all things,” and tell him to be seated in the group-time area. When all kids are seated, ask what they heard.
- **Introduce the unit and sing.** Show the unit banner and read the title. Tell kids that they will be learning about God and how He showed His love and power to His people. Sing “God, You Are Great.”
- **Read the Life Point and tell the Bible story.** Read the Life Point. Say: “God showed His love and power to protect Moses.” Choose a child to attach the Life Point to the unit banner. Show and read aloud the *protect* word card and its definition.



God Protected Moses

As he grew, she could not hide him any longer. She made a basket from reeds. She covered the basket with tar to keep it dry and set the basket in the reeds near the river. The baby’s sister watched the baby from a distance. A short time later, Pharaoh’s daughter came to the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent a servant girl to get it. When she saw the baby in the basket, he was crying. She felt sorry for him and said, “This is one of the Hebrew boys.”

The baby’s sister saw this happen and went to Pharaoh’s daughter. “Should I go and call one of the Hebrew women to take care of the baby?” she asked. Pharaoh’s daughter agreed. The girl brought her mother to Pharaoh’s daughter. The baby’s mother took care of him and when he was older, she took him back to Pharaoh’s daughter. He became her son. She named him Moses.

— BASED ON EXODUS 1:22–2:10; NUMBERS 26:59

- **Recall the Bible story.** Show the teaching picture and the word card. Remind kids of the definition. Invite each child to pull a question card from the bag. Read the questions and allow time for kids to answer the questions. Say: “God had special plans for Moses and protected him.”
- **Learn the Weekly Verse.** Open the Bible to Job 42:2. Read the verse. Lead the kids to repeat it together. Direct the kids to stand. Give the beanbag to a child to toss on the “Movement Board.” Lead the kids in doing the action as you say the verse together. Continue as time allows.
- **Make a Christ connection.** Many years after Moses, God sent Jesus to teach people how to follow Him.
- **Wrap up.** Show the “God Protected Moses” video.

BIBLE-LEARNING ACTIVITIES

- » Kids Activity Pages
- » Bible, small plastic baskets, ribbon
- » Cut the ribbon into 12-inch strands.

Teaching Tip: Use ribbon small enough to fit in the holes of the baskets.

WEAVE BASKETS

Arrange the baskets and ribbon on a table with the Bible

- Help each child complete a Kids Activity Page. Give hints as to the order of the Bible story.
- Open a Bible to Exodus 2. Remind the kids that Moses' mother made a basket by weaving reeds together. Show how they can weave with the ribbon and baskets.
- Tell the Bible story as the kids work. Say: "God protected Moses from being harmed. God loved and had plans for Moses. God is powerful and can do anything."
- Help kids find Moses' name in the Bible. *(puzzles)*

- » Pack Item:
8: "Fall Weekly Verses" (*Job 42:2*)
- » Bible, baby dolls, doll care items, baby blankets
- » **Optional:** Rocking chair
- » Use the strip to mark Job 42:2 in the Bible.

CARE FOR BABIES

Place the dolls and doll care items in the homeliving area Lay the Bible near the dolls

- Invite the kids to care for the babies. Ask the kids how they might have helped care for babies, such as siblings or cousins. Talk about ways to care for babies—feeding, changing, bathing, rocking, and so forth.
- Tell the Bible story as the kids care for the babies. Ask if they think Moses' mother cared for him like they are caring for the dolls. Say that his mother wanted to keep him safe, so she hid him in the reeds near the river; God made sure Moses was protected.
- Open the Bible and say the verse: "God can do all things. Job 42:2." Lead the kids to repeat the verse with you. *(dramatic play)*

- » Teaching Picture 1
- » Wooden blocks, toy trees, green and blue construction paper, tape, child-size scissors, tray
- » Cut the blue paper into wavy strips to represent water. Place the paper, scissors, and tape on a tray.

BUILD A RIVER SCENE

Place the teaching picture, tray, and trees near the blocks

- As kids show interest in the block area, point to the teaching picture and the items on the tray. Suggest the boys and girls use the materials to build a river scene, like the one in the picture. Encourage them to use the green paper and scissors to cut out reeds, which are like big pieces of grass, and tape them to blocks to put along the river.
- Tell the Bible story as the kids work. Remind the kindergartners that God protected Moses from being harmed by Pharaoh.
- Show the teaching picture and ask kids to point to different things they see in the picture. Say: "God protected Moses because God can do anything." *(blocks)*

STAMP WORDS

Arrange the letter stamps, ink pads, and paper on a table Display the word cards Place the missions information in the Bible at Exodus 2, and lay it with the other materials

- Show kids the cards, read each word, and tell how it relates to the Bible story. Invite the kindergartners to stamp these words on paper along with any other words they can spell, such as their names.



BIBLE-LEARNING ACTIVITIES

- Tell the Bible story as the kids work. Say that God can do all things. He protected Moses from being harmed when he was a baby. Comment that God uses His power to show His love.
- Open the Bible and show the kindergartners where the Bible story is located. Show the missions pictures to the kids and talk about Columbus, Ohio, and how people who live there need to know about God's power and love. (*writing*)

PLAY A GAME

Lay the gameboard on a table Place the letters in the basket Lay the game pieces on the start square and the die on the gameboard

- Invite a group of kids to play the game. Explain that the goal is to complete the statement, "God Is Great," by landing on certain spaces and placing letters. Encourage the kids to take turns rolling the die and moving around the board.
- Tell the Bible story as the kids play. Say: "God is great and powerful and shows love for people. God loved Moses and protected him."
- When the kids place all the letters, open the Bible and lead them in saying: "God can do all things. Job 42:2." (*games*)

MAKE A BIBLE VERSE MARKER

Tape one piece of clear contact plastic per child to a table, sticky side up Lay the tissue paper on the table within the reach of the kids

- Invite kids to make a Bible marker. Direct them to stick pieces of tissue paper on the sticky plastic. They can make whatever designs they wish.
- Tell the Bible story as the boys and girls work. Say that God loved Moses and used His power to protect him.
- When a child is finished with her art, give her a Bible verse sticker to add. Then help her cover the marker with another piece of plastic.
- Open the Bible to Job 42:2 and show the verse to the kids as you say it together. (*art*)

USE THE COLORING PAGE

- Talk about the Bible story as the kids color the page.
- Say the Weekly Verse together.

CLEAN UP

- Guide boys and girls to work together to clean up the room.

TRANSITION/GROUP TIME

SNACK

Include the kids in the distribution of the snack. Ask for volunteers to pray. Lead the kindergartners to clean up after snack. Thank them for their help.

MOVE TO GROUP TIME

Write the letters *p, r, o, t, e, c, t* on small note cards. Hide them around the room. Tell kids to search for a letter and bring it to the group-time area.

TALK ABOUT THE BIBLE STORY

GOD PROTECTED MOSES—BASED ON EXODUS 1:22–2:10;
NUMBERS 26:59

— Use the letters kids found to spell the word *protect*. Read the word. Say they will hear how God protected someone.

SUMMARIZE THE BIBLE STORY

(In advance, read the story from the Bible and the Kids Activity Page. During the session, open the Bible and tell or summarize the Bible story.)

- Pharaoh, the king of Egypt wanted to hurt the Hebrew baby boys because he thought there were too many Hebrews.
- One mother hid her baby for three months. When she could no longer hide him, she made a basket from reeds and set it in the reeds near the river. The baby's sister watched the baby from a distance.
- Pharaoh's daughter saw the basket. She sent a servant to get it. She saw the baby crying and felt sorry for him. She knew he was a Hebrew baby.
- The baby's sister went to Pharaoh's daughter. "Should I call a Hebrew woman to take care of the baby?" she asked.
- Pharaoh's daughter agreed. The girl brought her mother. When the baby was older, his mother took him to Pharaoh's daughter. She named him Moses.

REVIEW THE BIBLE STORY

- Why were the Hebrew baby boys in danger?
- How did a mother protect her baby? Who found the baby near the river?
- Think: Why do you think the mother hid her baby near the river?

EMPHASIZE THE LIFE POINT

- Tell the kids that God can do anything.

SING TOGETHER

Sing to the tune of “God Is So Good”:

*God is so good,
God shows His love,
God keeps us safe,
God can do all things.*

SAY THE BIBLE VERSE

Open the Bible and say the Weekly Verse. Lead the kids to repeat the verse with you two times. Tell the kids to say the verse while they pat their heads, pat their knees, and touch their toes.

PRAY

Ask kids to list any prayer concerns. Allow any child an opportunity to pray if he wishes to do so. Close the prayer time by thanking God for how great He is and for being able to do all things.

BIBLE-LEARNING ACTIVITIES

Emphasize: God can do anything.

- 1. Build with interlocking bricks.** Place the bricks on the floor with a Bible and a Kids Activity Page, showing the teaching picture (or use Teaching Picture 1). Talk about the Bible story as kids build with the bricks. Say: “Moses’ mother made a basket to help hide him and keep him safe. God protected Moses, because God can do anything.” Point to the picture on the activity page and suggest kids make something from the picture. Open the Bible to Exodus 2 and show where the Bible story is located. Say the Weekly Verse together.
- 2. Find matching pairs.** Print the letters *M*, *O*, *S*, *E*, and *S* on cardstock squares. Make two sets using two colors of markers. Lay the squares facedown on a table or the floor. Invite the kids to take turns finding matching pairs of letters. Open the Bible to Exodus 2. Tell the Bible story as the kids play. Say: “God protected Moses because God can do anything.”
- 3. Play “Find the Baby.”** Hide a baby doll in the room. Gather a group of kids to look around the room to find the baby. When the baby is found, tell the group a fact from the Bible

story. Lead the boys and girls in saying the Life Point. Choose a child to hide the baby, while the others face a wall. Continue by telling another fact from the story and saying the Weekly Verse after the baby is found.

- 4. Play a relay game.** Write one word of the Weekly Verse on one color of cards and the words of the Life Point on a different color of cards. Mix the cards and stack them by a wall. Line up the kids behind a tape line about four feet away. Say: “Go,” for the first child to walk to the cards, take a card, walk back, and give a high five to the next child. Continue until each card is chosen. Assist the kids to form two groups. Help the kids put their words in order. Say the verse and Life Point together.

CLEAN UP

Involve the kindergartners in cleaning the room. Assign specific tasks to small groups of kids. Help the kids know where to put away toys and other materials. Thank them for their help.

FIND LETTERS

Stand in a circle with the boys and girls. Use the word cards you made for the Bible-learning activity relay game. Mix the cards and place them in a pile in the center of the circle. Play a song or sing the song in “Sing Together” as the kids pass a beanbag. When the song ends or you stop the music, direct the child holding the beanbag to take a card from the stack and sit down. Continue, skipping over the seated kids. When all the cards have been chosen, assist the kindergartners to form two groups. Help them put the words in order to show the Weekly Verse or the Life Point. Say each one with the group.

DISMISS

Help each child gather her belongings and a Kids Activity Page. As each child leaves, say the Weekly Verse together and give her a high five. Thank the parents for bringing their child to church.

BONUS TEACHING IDEAS

SESSION 1

MOVE TO GROUP TIME. Whisper to each child: “God can do all things,” and tell him to be seated in the group-time area. When all kids are seated, ask what they heard.

INTRODUCE THE UNIT AND SING. Show the unit banner and read the title. Tell kids that they will be learning about God and how He showed His love and power to His people. Sing “God, You Are Great.”

CONTINUE TO SING AND MOVE. Play “God You Are Great” again. Instruct kids to clap their hands and pat their knees as the music plays.

PRACTICE THE UNIT VERSE. Open the Bible to 2 Samuel 7:22 and say the verse. Show kids the “2 Samuel 7:22” poster. Point to each word of the verse as you say it. Read and point to the words again as the kids say the verse with you. Say the verse with the kids again as they snap their fingers on each word.

PRACTICE A BIBLE SKILL. Tell kids that our Bible stories in this unit are from the book of Exodus. Show the *Exodus* card from “Books of the Bible Cards” (Printables). Distribute a Bible to each child or pair of children. Ask teachers to help the kids find the book of Exodus in the Bible.

LEARN THE WEEKLY VERSE. Open the Bible to Job 42:2. Read the verse. Lead the kids to repeat it together. Direct the kids to stand. Give the beanbag to a child to toss on the “Movement Board.” Lead the kids in doing the action as you say the verse together. Continue as time allows.

MAKE A CHRIST CONNECTION. Many years after Moses, God sent Jesus to teach people how to follow Him.

WRAP UP. Show the “God Protected Moses” video.
