LEADER BIBLE STUDY

CONTEXT AND COMMENTARY FOR PERSONAL STUDY AND PREPARATION

(For age-appropriate language, use the Bible story on the following page)

After God miraculously brought His people through on dry ground, He drowned Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and his riders in the Red Sea (Exodus 14). God rescued His people in a way that no one could have imagined, and the people responded with fervent praise. They danced and sang with all their might, glorifying the God who rescued them (Exodus 15:1-22).

Three days later, the worship service became a distant memory. The people had traveled through the desert without nding water. When they nally discovered water, it was undrinkable. Their victory song quickly turned into a cacophony of groans.

This pattern of forgetfulness would come to de ne the Israelites. When God provided for them, they responded with praise. As soon as things became dicult, they would rebel against Him. Over and over, the Lord patiently reminded the Israelites that rescuing them was His plan and that He would be the One to see them through to the promised land. All they had to do was believe Him and obey His commands. God then proved Himself by going over and above what they needed. Sometimes that looked like 12 springs and 70 date palms. Sometimes it looked like manna in the morning and quail at night. Sometimes it looked like a weekly day of complete rest for a people who had been cruelly forced to work their entire lives.

God made it clear that the Israelites did not have to do anything to earn His provision. His gracious gifts were freely available. When the people saw how God provided for them, they would know that He was the Lord. All God wanted from them was their trust.

Jesus said, "This is the work of God—that you believe in the one he has sent" (John 6:29). As you pray this week, thank God for providing everything you need for an abundant life. Praise Him for His faithfulness and the promise of eternal life for all who believe.

BIBLE STORY FOR 1s

GATHER TIME FOR OLDER 2s

- Gather and sing. Sing and move to "Stand Up and Clap!" Distribute the cards. Ask: "Who has the picture of (item)?" Invite the boys and girls to show the cards when you name them. Collect the cards when named. Comment these are pictures of things we need: food, clothing, and a place to live. State that God helps people have what they need. Say that we will learn how God took care of His people while they were in the wilderness. Sing "God Is Good."
- Tell the Bible story and review. Open the Bible. Display the teaching picture. Tell the Bible story. Show the Moses gure. Ask the toddlers who it is. (Moses) Remind the kids that God provided manna and water to Moses and the people in the wilderness. Say that God gives us what we need. Let each child hold the Moses gure and say: "Moses."
- Hear the Bible verse. Open the Bible to the Weekly Verse strip. Display and read aloud the verse twice. Encourage the preschoolers to whisper the words of the verse along with you and then shout the words.
- Wrap up. Pray, thanking God for giving the children what they need. Sing "God, You Are Great."



CHOOSE YOUR TIME

Decide when to have group time; then select learning activities to use before and/or after group time.

- » Pack Items:
 - 15: "W eekly Verses"
 - 20: "Provision Cards"
 - 33: "Door Poster Unit 1"
 - 36: "Bible People" (Adult Moses)
- » Teaching Picture 3
- » Music
- » Bible, scissors, tape, craft stick
- » Separate today's Weekly Verse strip and place it in the Bible at Philippians 4. Separate the Provision Cards. Post the door poster outside the room door. Cut apart the adult Moses figur . Tape the figure to the craft stick.

Tip: Keep the Moses figure to use in the next session.

BIBLE-LEARNING ACTIVITIES

» Pack Item: 20: "Provision Cards"

FEED THE MOUTH

Draw a face on the lid of a shoebox Cut a "mouth" with a slit large enough to push the cards through

- Place the cards facedown on a table.
- Invite the boys and girls to turn over cards to faceup. Help the toddlers name the items.
- Choose one card at a time and invite one child to pick up that card and "feed" the mouth on the box by pushing the card through the slit.
- Continue until all the cards get picked up and "fed." Repeat if desired.
- Remind the preschoolers that God loves people and helps them have what they need.
- » Magnetic letters; large bowl; scoops, strainers, or small cups

SCOOP LETTERS

Place the letters in a bowl

- Invite the kids to use the items to scoop out the letters from the bowl.
- Choose a letter that is scooped out and relate it to the Bible story (M is for Moses. Moses led the people in the wilderness and so on.). Continue with other letters.
- Guide the preschoolers to take turns scooping the letters.

» Paper plate, plastic cutlery, paper cup, construction paper, marker

TRACE AND MATCH

Trace the items on construction paper in the position of a place setting

- Invite the boys and girls to match and place the items to the shapes.
- Comment that God loves us and gives us the food we need to eat.
- Say a brief prayer, thanking God for taking care of us.
- Review the Bible story as the toddlers match items.

3 opaque cups in 3 different color

TRACK AN OBJECT

Place three cups on a table, placing the cotton ball under one cup

- Move the cups around and challenge the boys and girls to follow the cup with their eyes and guess which cup the cotton is under.
- Tell the children to name the color of the cup.
- Show the cotton ball and explain that God gave the people food called *manna* which was white like the cotton ball.

» Cotton balls, small bags (1 per child)

GATHER MANNA

- Review: "While the people slept, God sent bread for them to eat. The bread was called *manna*."
- Guide the preschoolers to pretend to sleep. Spread cotton balls all around the room as the children sleep.
- Invite the boys and girls to gather the cotton in their bags. Stress to not put the cotton in their mouths.
- Empty the lled containers on a table. Tell the toddlers that the people ate the bread God sent for them.



BIBLE-LEARNING ACTIVITIES

JUMP TO SHAPES

Tape large shapes (square, rectangle, triangle, star) on the floor around the room about a foot apart with room for the kids to stand inside each shape

- Explain to the preschoolers that you will play music. Say that when the music stops, everyone should stand inside a shape.
- Play "Zip Stomp." Stop the music. Direct the boys and girls to step inside the shapes. Let each group of children name the shapes they are standing in. Assist as needed.
- State: "God helps people have what they need."
- Say the Weekly Verse before the music starts each round.

BOWL WITH BOTTLES

- Place the bottles on the oor in a three-pin or ten-pin format.
- Invite one child at a time, to roll a ball from several feet away, attempting to knock down the bottles.
- Count the number of bottles each child knocks down.
- Say the Life Point and review the Bible story as you set up the bottles each time.

» Filled plastic water bottles, rubber playground ball(s)

» Music

» Painter's tape

FOLLOW A PATH

Print and cut apart as many footprints as desired Tape the footprints firmly on the floor in a line around the roo

- Invite the boys and girls to follow the path of footprints, placing their feet on top of the footprints as they walk.
- Occasionally point out and di erentiate between the preschoolers left and right feet.
- Remind the toddlers that God took care of the people as they walked in the wilderness.
- Stop along the path or at the end and talk about the missions work in Ohio. Show the missions pictures. Relate any missions emphases your church is involved in as well.
- Say a prayer thanking God for taking care of each boy and girl.

CLEAN UP

• Lead the children to help return toys and other materials to their places. Consider using the footprints from the previous activity to lead to the area where toys are stored.

SING TOGETHER

SOLVE SHAPE PUZZLES

Gather: Construction paper, marker, scissors **Do:** Cut large circles, squares, triangles, and rectangles out of construction paper Cut each of the shapes in half

- Place all the half shapes on a table.
- Invite the boys and girls to nd the matches and put the shape pieces together.
- Congratulate the toddlers when they solve the puzzles.
- Remark that God loves us and helps us.

PRETEND TO PICNIC

Gather: Basket, toy food, blanket

Do: Place a blanket on the oor or ground

- Lead the kids to sit on the blanket together.
- Invite each child to take one item out of the picnic basket.
- Name and comment on each item.
- Pretend to have a picnic, remembering to thank God for the food.
- State that God gave His people food and water in the wilderness.

FOLLOW THE TEACHING PICTURE

Gather: Teaching Picture 3

- Guide the toddlers to stand in a single- le line with you as the leader.
- Turn and face the preschoolers, holding the teaching picture so they can see it.
- Slowly walk backward as the boys and girls follow you.
- Walk and retell the Bible story.
- Make the point that when the people followed God's directions, God took care of them.
- Let the children take turns being the leader.
- Say as the toddlers walk: "God helps people."

CONNECT DOTS

Gather: Dot stickers, paper, crayons

- Guide the toddlers to say "thank you" as you give each child a paper and several stickers.
- Invite the children to place their stickers on their papers and color with the crayons.
- Comment that it is important to say thank you to God for giving us everything we need.

PLAY "WHAT'S MISSING?"

Gather: Bible, Iled water bottle, toy bread, toy meat, cell phone, blanket or towel

Do: Place all items on a at surface Take a picture of the items with your phone

- Gather a few preschoolers to play.
- Mention that God gave the people water and food; things they needed.
- Name each item, leading the toddlers to repeat after you.
- Tell that you will cover the items and remove one of them.
- Cover, remove an item, then ask the children to name what is missing. Show the picture for the boys and girls to point to the missing item, if needed.
- Talk about things the toddlers need that God gives them (food, family, home, and so on)

CLEAN UP

Comment: "God gave us a nice church. We can help take care of the church by keeping it neat and clean." Lead the toddlers to clean the room.

DISMISS

Help the kids gather their papers and belongings. Thank them for coming. Remind the parents to review the Bible story on the Kids Activity Page.








Footprints
