

Proverbs On-the-Go Discussion Guide

Watching videos is a good way to learn. But talking about the content offers several additional advantages. Discussion creates a deeper connection to the learning. It can instantly inspire some real-life application of biblical wisdom. And it can strengthen the relationships between members of your family. So get the most out of your *Proverbs* Summer-on-the Go Bible study by using the following discussion points. Or use them as a starting point to create a unique conversation tailor-made for your family.

Week 1 - Pursuing Wisdom

Reference Text: Proverbs 1-7

1. How do we obtain wisdom?
2. How is wisdom from God different from other kinds of wisdom?
3. How does godly wisdom help us pursue what God is telling us to do?

BIG IDEA: Proverbs provides wisdom for every area of life at every stage of life.

Week 2 - Receiving Wisdom from the Word

Reference Text: Proverbs 8-14

1. Read Proverbs 3:5-6. What does God promise to those who trust His Word?
2. Why do we need wisdom from God's Word?
3. What are some ways you can protect your heart from influences that might lead you away from God?
4. What does it look like to actively trust God in your daily life?

BIG IDEA: A wise way to live is to pursue integrity.

Week 3 - Growing in Wisdom Through Relationships

Reference Text: Proverbs 15-21

1. Who influences your life the most?
2. If we have perfect wisdom in God's Word, why would we need other counselors?
3. Who are your "counselors" (relationships in your life that walk with God who you trust to speak honestly into your life)? Are they leading you to God or away from Him? Explain.

BIG IDEA: A wise way to live is in fellowship with others.

Week 4 - Walking in Wisdom Through Life

Reference Text: Proverbs 22-31

1. How do you know if you are living in sync with God's plan and purpose for your life?
2. What do I do if I recognize that I am out of sync with God's purpose and plan for my life?
3. What is my responsibility to the next generation?
4. How do I fulfill my responsibility to the next generation?

BIG IDEA: A wise way to live is to faithfully do what God has called you to do.
