READ JAMES 1:19-27.

READ JAMES 2:14-26.

Write a definition of success based on our culture's standards:

#### **READ JAMES 1:19-27.**

How do these verses paint a different picture of what "success" looks like?

Many times, our culture teaches that in order to get ahead, we should focus on ourselves and make sure we're taken care of at whatever cost, even at the expense of others. Culture says to do whatever possible to make the most money or get the best job. However, God teaches us the exact opposite. In His Word, He tells us to take care of those who can't take care of themselves and to love others as much as we love ourselves.

# How does James describe Scripture in verse 25? Do you tend to think of the commands of the Bible as restrictive or freeing? Explain.

Contrary to what culture may teach us, the "freedoms" offered by the world actually bind us into much turmoil and pain. When we go beyond simply being hearers of the Word and follow through with what it says, we experience the freedom that God's plan offers, and we also show others God's truth by how we live. We have many opportunities to share with others about the freedom we have in Christ.

#### READ JAMES 2:14-26.

What does James use as an example of works in this passage? Why do you think he chose this example?

What is an example of a person or group of people you could serve in this way where you live?

#### Why is not just having faith but living out our faith by serving others so important?

By working out our faith or continuing to experience opportunities to serve others, we see God's provision and learn more about His character. Taking on His character grows us more deeply in faith. We can find joy in trials because we know those hardest times will give us more opportunity to grow in our faith. We can also turn our trials and difficult times into something positive by helping others who may go through the same situation.

### PRAY

Thank God that He has claimed you as His own. If you have not yet entered into a personal relationship with God through Christ, talk to your youth pastor or Bible study leader today. Ask God for wisdom in the choices you make throughout today. Ask Him to give you a sensitivity and tenderness toward others' needs around you. Ask Him to help you recognize opportunities to act now by loving others well and to grow in your faith today.
