THE FIVE EYE-OPENERS

The more <u>entangled</u> we are, the less faithful we will be with what has been <u>entrusted</u> to us.

• You are <u>not</u> <u>your</u> <u>own</u> <u>worst</u> <u>enemy</u>.

• But you are your <u>own</u> <u>worst</u> <u>enemy's</u> best <u>accomplice</u>.

You can have a <u>sincere</u> and <u>pure</u> devotion to Christ and be <u>completely</u> <u>seduced</u> by the devil.

2. This <u>faith-life</u> is a <u>fight</u> from <u>beginning</u> <u>to</u> <u>end</u>.

"<u>fight</u>" – Greek "*agōnízomai*" from *agōn*, <u>conflict</u>. To <u>contend</u> <u>for</u> <u>victory</u> in the public games. It generally came to mean to fight, wrestle. Figuratively, it is the task of faith in persevering amid temptation and opposition. It also came to mean to <u>take</u> <u>pains</u> to wrestle as in an <u>award</u> <u>contest</u>, straining every <u>nerve</u> to the <u>uttermost</u> towards the <u>goal</u>.
