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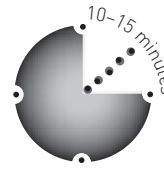
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Skill Centers



Grades 4–6 Introductory Meeting

Bible Passages:

Genesis 1:27;
Genesis 2:15-23;
Genesis 5:1-2;
Psalm 119:73

Verse: Genesis 1:27

Key Passage: None

Bible Story:

In God's Image

Levels of Biblical Learning Statements:

Grade 4: God created people in His image.

Grades 5–6: Life is a gift from God.

Meeting Goals:

Identify that there is an Old and New Testament in the Bible and how many books are in each Testament. Introduce divisions. Show how to read and find a Bible reference: book, chapter, and verse. Explain Key Passages.

Name Tags

As parents and children enter, welcome them and invite them to write their names on a name tag. Encourage them to wear the name tag for the entire meeting.

Get Acquainted

Wave a hula hoop over your head and say, “Roll ’em!” to get everyone’s attention. Say: “Thank you for coming to this introductory meeting of Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills. You will learn about the Bible and have fun at the same time! Let’s play a get acquainted game.”

Distribute the “Autograph Tic-tac-toe” sheets and pencils to each parent and each child. Say: “Try to fill up all nine squares with autographs of people who fit the category in that square. At the same time you will discover some interesting facts about each other. Wave the hula hoop as a signal to begin the game. Play the instrumental music as they play the game. After about five minutes, wave the hula hoop to call the group back together. Call out each category from the tic-tac-toe sheet, and ask volunteers to share whose autograph they got for each category.

Say: “This meeting is to help you understand what will be happening each week in Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills. Parents, it will enable you to help your children in the learning process.” Briefly review the meeting schedule. Continue: “As the children arrive each week, they will choose a Skill Center. Parents and children, we invite you to experience Skill Centers. Try one and then move on to another one. If you are participating in Children’s Bible Drill, go directly to the Skill Check Center each time. After you have completed the Skill Check, you may choose another center. Children’s Bible Drill participants, follow me to the Skill Check Center. Others may choose a center and get started.”

Skill Check Center

Show parents and children the “Skill Check List” and explain how you will use this chart to monitor the Bible drillers’ progress each week.

Name Tags

- Provide blank name tags, and fine-point markers.

Get Acquainted

- Provide a hula hoop
- Make a copy of “Autograph Tic-tac-toe” (Item 13) for each parent and child. Provide pencils.
- Provide a music playing device.

Skill Check

- Provide “Skill Check List” (Item 1) and a pencil for each child.

Old Testament Divisions Game and New Testament Divisions Game

- Tape two hula hoops flat on the floor with masking tape. Create a five piece pie inside each hula hoop with masking tape strips. Place a red gummed dot in one of the pie pieces of each hula hoop.
- Provide the “Divisions of the Bible Cards” (Item 2).

Gathering Game

- Provide a music playing device. Cue the instrumental praise music.
- Display the “Books of the Bible Poster” (Item 11).
- Tape a strip of masking tape down the center of the floor dividing the room into two equal sections. In large letters write *Old* on a sheet of paper, and *New* on another sheet of paper. Tape “Old” in the center of the left wall, and “New” in the center of the right wall.

Teaching Tip: During the Gathering Game, be sensitive to children who have no previous Bible skills. They may want to refer to the “Books of the Bible” poster for help.

Bible Introduction

- Provide a Bible, activity pages 5 and 6, and a pencil for each child.
- Print each of the following words or phrases on separate 8½-by-11-inch pieces of paper:
 - Heavens and earth
 - Disobeying God’s command

Old Testament Divisions Game

Children can learn the names and the order of the divisions of the Old Testament. Give a child the Old Testament Division Cards and ask him to place them in the hula hoop in order. Suggest that each child say the name of the division as he places the card. Indicate that the section with the red dot is the beginning place.

New Testament Divisions Game

Children can learn the names and the order of the divisions of the New Testament. Give a child the New Testament Division Cards and ask him to place them in the hula hoop in order. Suggest that the child say the name of the division as he places the card. Indicate that the section with the red dot is the beginning place.

Gathering Game

Begin playing the instrumental music and tell the children that when they hear the music each week it is time to gather for Group Skills time. Explain that Group Skills time will always begin with a game.

Invite the parents and children to stand on the masking tape line. Indicate the “Old” and “New” signs. Explain that these signs refer to the two main divisions of the Bible, the Old and New Testaments. Say: “I will say the name of a Bible book. If you think it is in the Old Testament, move to that side of the room. If you think it is in the New Testament, move to that side of the room.” Randomly call out books of the Bible beginning with those which the kids would be most familiar. Call “Genesis” last.

Ask all to be seated and say to the parents, “During this time each week the children will hear a Bible story, learn the memory verse, and work on activities to reinforce the Bible skills they are learning.”

Bible Introduction

Say: “Another word for the *Bible* is *God’s Word*. That means that the Bible is God’s word to you. The Bible is different from any other book you will read. That is one reason it is so important for you to learn how to use the Bible. Since it is God’s word to you, you need to know how to find what He has said. This year we will start at the very beginning of the Old Testament with the Book of Genesis.” Explain that the Book of Genesis is a book of beginnings; a book of firsts. Invite everyone to open their Bible to Genesis.

Distribute the activity pages and pencils. Call attention to “Bible Firsts.” Work as a group to complete the activity. Ask a volunteer to read the first question and choose an answer from the word cards taped on the wall. Continue until each question is answered correctly. (*Answers: 1. heaven and earth, 2. the man/Adam, 3. God, 4. disobeying God’s command not to eat the fruit, 5. Eve, 6. Cain, 7. Abel, 8. Cain, 9. Ishmael, 10. Rebekah*)

Comment that next week the Bible story will be from Genesis. Ask, “If you were asked to describe the Bible, what would you say?” Allow each child to respond. Continue, “I thought you would be interested in hearing

what two of the great American leaders of the past had to say about the Bible.” Read the following quotes:

- “It is impossible to rightly govern the world without God and the Bible.”
—George Washington.
- “I believe the Bible is the best gift God has even given to men. All the good from the Savior of the world is communicated to us through this Book.”
—Abraham Lincoln.

Call attention to “The Bible from A to Z” on the activity page. Form groups of two or three and allow 5–7 minutes for parents and children to work on this activity. When they have completed the activity, call attention to the A–Z sheet of craft paper on the wall. Invite the groups to call out all their responses to A on their activity pages. As a group, decide on the one you like best and write it beside A on the craft paper. Continue through the alphabet inserting the words provided for X and Z. When the acrostic is completed, lead the group to read it. Begin by saying together, “The Bible is ... ”(*Start with the A word and continue through Z.*)

Reading and Finding References

Explain that when you understand how the Bible is organized, it makes it easier to use. Say, “In the Skill Centers you were introduced to some ways that the Bible is organized.”

Point to the two hula hoops and ask the following questions:

1. What are the two main divisions of the Bible? (*Old Testament and New Testament*).
2. Each Testament is divided into how many divisions? (*five in each division*)

Hold up the poster board with the words *Book, Chapter, Verse* on it and invite the children to complete the following sentences:

3. Each division is divided into _____. (*Books*)
4. Each book is divided into _____. (*Chapters*)
5. Each chapter is divided into _____. (*Verses*)

Say, “We’ve already talked about Genesis being the first book in the Old Testament.” Guide the children and parents to open their Bibles to Genesis and find chapter 1. Next, guide them to look in chapter 1 for verse 27. When everyone has found the reference, read the verse together.

Guide each child to find a partner. Explain that the children can practice finding the following references. Turn the poster board over to display the references printed on it. Say: “We’ve heard what some great leaders of our country had to say about the Bible and we’ve heard what you had to say about the Bible when we did the A–Z activity. As you find and read these references, you will discover what the Bible has to say about itself.” After all children have located the first reference, call on someone to read it. Make the following comments about each verse:

Psalms 119:11—“Hiding God’s word in your heart helps you not to sin.”

Psalms 119:105—“Just as a light guides you in the dark, the Bible guides your life.”

- Tape the words and phrases to the wall at the children’s eye level in the Group Skills area.
- Using a wide-point marker, print large letters of the alphabet A–Z down the left side of a long sheet of craft paper. Tape the paper to the wall.

Reading and Finding References

- Lay the two hula-hoops from the Skill Centers in the center of the semicircle.

Teaching Tip: Remember that some of the children may not be familiar with finding references. Pair a child who has previously been in Children’s Bible Drill or Sunday School with a child who has not.

- On a sheet of poster board print these three words: *Book, Chapter, Verse*. Directly under *Book*, write *Genesis*. Under *Chapter* write *1*. Under *Verse* write *27*.
- On the back of the poster board print these references:
Psalms 119:11
Psalms 119:105
Isaiah 40:8
Mark 13:31
John 20:30-31
2 Timothy 3:16-17
Hebrews 4:12

Isaiah 40:8—“God’s Word will never change and it will never be destroyed.”

Mark 13:31—“The earth as we know it will one day no longer exist, but God’s Word will always exist.”

John 20:30-31—“The Bible was written to guide you to believe in Jesus Christ as Savior.”

2 Timothy 3:16-17—“The Bible instructs you in how to be saved. God wrote every word of it through His inspired writers. It teaches and trains you to do the right thing so you can become the person God created you to be.”

Hebrews 4:12—“The Bible is unlike any other book. Its words are living words of God. The Bible has the power to expose our thoughts and attitudes.”

Lead in prayer thanking God for the Bible. Ask Him to guide you this year as you study His Word together.

Memory Verse Treasure

Hunt

- Gather nine paper plates. Divide the memory verse into three phrases. Write one phrase on each paper plate. Make three sets of the memory verse using three paper plates for each set. Hide the plates around the room.
- Lay three hula hoops in the center of the semicircle.

Memory Verse Treasure Hunt

Form three teams. Say: “When I say, ‘Roll ’em!’ each team will spread out across the room to hunt for phrases from the memory verse. When you have found all the phrases that will allow you to complete the verse, bring your paper plates back to one of the hula hoops and put them in order inside the hula hoop. If you find a phrase that you already have, leave it and hunt for the one you need.” Cheer the teams on as they search. Allow all three teams to complete the verse, and then congratulate the winning team. Read the verse together. Remove the first phrase of the verse, and read it again. Remove the second phrase, and read it again. Remove the third phrase and lead the group to say the verse from memory.

Ask, “What does it mean that we are made in the image of God?” (*Wait for responses.*) Look at a child and say: “(*Child’s name*), I can see that you look like your dad (*or mom*). Genesis 1:27 says we were created in God’s image. That means that of all of God’s creation we are the most special because we are like God. You’ll learn more about that next week.”

Introduction of Key Passages

Explain that in addition to a memory verse for each meeting, children will study 10 Key Passages during the year that are a part of the Children’s Bible Drill. Some of the Key Passages for this year are:

- The Creation: Genesis 1–2:3
- The Israelites Leave Egypt: Exodus 12:37-42
- The Great Commandments: Mark 12:28-34

The children will learn where to find the passages and what they mean. They will not memorize the verses in the Key Passages, only the reference and the title of the Key Passage.

Explanation of Skill Options

- Write each of the following on a separate sheet of paper:
 1. Bible Skills
 2. Recreation

Explanation of Skill Options

Explain that each week during the last part of the meeting, the children can choose one of the Skill Options and work there for about 30 minutes. Describe the following options.

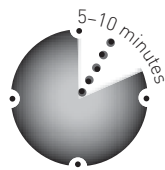
Bible Skills—The Bible Skills Option includes focused Bible skill development games, activities, instruction, and practice in Children’s Bible Drill. All of the children in Children’s Bible Drill should select this option. Children not participating in Children’s Bible Drill may also choose this option.

Recreation—The Recreation Option provides active games that help children continue to learn and apply the Bible skills and biblical learning from the meeting. Competition is kept at a low level. The focus is to help the children concentrate on what they are learning.

Crafts—The Crafts Option includes crafts that children can use to learn or to demonstrate the application of Bible skills or biblical learning from the meeting. Each craft is designed to be completed in one meeting.

Service—The Service Option includes learning, planning, and participating in individual, family, church, and community service projects that help the children apply memory verses and biblical learning. They may make something to give away, plan a ministry project to help someone, or learn a skill they can use to serve others.

Say, “For this meeting only, parents and children will preview each option for 10 minutes.” Form four groups, keeping parents and their children in the same group. Assign each group one of the options to begin with. Say, “When I say, ‘Roll ’em!’ you will know that it is time to move to the next option.” Show them the numbered signs and direct them to move to the next number at your signal.



Family Bible Skills to Go

Give each family a sheet of construction paper, scissors, and a marker. Guide them to cut out the first initial of their last name. Point out the list of verses taped to the wall. Say: “These are verses that your children can memorize this year. Choose one of the verses that you will memorize as a family this coming week and write that reference on your initial.” Beginning with the family to your right, instruct them to say, “We are the (*Smith*) family and we will memorize (*reference of verse*) this week.”

Invite any parents who want to serve as leaders or who want to furnish light refreshments to talk with you following the meeting.

Lead in prayer thanking God for His Word and for the opportunity of working together to learn more about it.

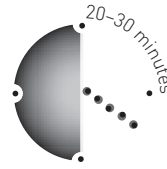
4. Service.

- Tape each sheet of paper on the wall in the appropriate Skill Option area.

Family Bible Skills to Go

- Print the reference only of the Red Cycle “Bible Verse Cards”
 - Item 5a CSB®
 - Item 5b KJV
 - Tape the cards to the wall in the area where families will gather at the end of the meeting.
 - Provide sheets of assorted construction paper, scissors, and a marker for each family.
- Teaching Tip:** Keep in mind that the child and the parent may have different last names. They may choose which initial to cut out.

Bible Skills



Bible Skills

- Provide:
 - a computer or device and the “Children’s Bible Drill Demonstration Video” (Item 101).
 - a copy of the “Bible Drill Commands ” (Item 15) for each family.
 - the “Divisions of the Bible Cards,” (Item 2).
 - two hula hoops.
 - a Children’s Bible Drill Bible in the version you are using to show to the group.
- Display the “Books of the Bible Poster” (Item 11).
- Make one set of the “Bible Verse Key Ring Cards” from the Bible version you are using:
 - (Item 6a CSB®)
 - (Item 6b KJV).
- Make one set of the “Key Passage Key Ring Cards” (Item 8).
- Provide Bibles.

Bible Skills

Guide the children and parents to sit together. Invite children who do not have parents present to sit with another family.

Explain that the Bible Skills Option is primarily for children preparing for Children’s Bible Drill. Children memorize 25 verses, 10 Key Passages, and the books of the Bible. They can participate in a church drill, an associational drill, and a regional (state) drill which requires them to recall the verses or find a book or a Key Passage in 10 seconds. A certain number of correct answers in each drill level qualifies the child to advance to the next level. Emphasize that Children’s Bible Drill is a wonderful opportunity. It is also a commitment for both the children and the parents. Drillers must work at home and will need their parents’ help. Because of this commitment, not every child will wish to participate. Tell parents and children they can decide sometime during the next month whether they wish to participate.

Show the video of the drill demonstration. Give each family a copy of the “Bible Drill Commands Poster” and review the commands listed. Enlist a leader to demonstrate the commands as you call them.

Show a Children’s Bible Drill Bible. Tell the group that Bible drillers must use a Bible like this and that they will be given a copy when they decide to participate. Remind them that they cannot write or mark in the Bible.

Show the group the “Bible Verse Key Ring Cards” and the “Key Passage Key Ring Cards.” Tell them that each Bible drill participant will receive a set of each of these to help them study.

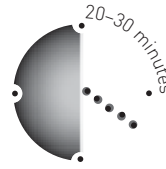
Review the divisions of the Old and New Testaments using the hula hoops. Indicate that one hula hoop represents the Old Testament and the other represents the New Testament.

Form two teams. Give one team the Old Testament Division Cards. Give the other team the New Testament Division Cards. Tell the children they may refer to the Books of the Bible Poster for help. Say, “Knowing these divisions will help you find any book in the Bible quickly.”

Invite the children to open their Bibles to Deuteronomy as you open your Bible to Deuteronomy. Hold the pages from Genesis through Deuteronomy between your two hands. Allow time for the family groups to hold their Bibles the same way. Say: “These five books are in the division of Law in the Old Testament. It is believed they were authored by Moses.” Invite the kids to say the first five books of the Bible together.

Thank the group for their attention and prepare your area for the next group.

Recreation



Old Testament Book Relay

Place one set of the Old Testament book cards in each basket. Place the baskets about six feet apart at one end of the recreation area.

Form two relay teams. Guide them to line up one behind the other at the opposite end of the room from where you placed the baskets.

Give these instructions. At your signal, the first player from each team will use the hula hoop like a jump rope and jump to his team's basket. He will pick three cards from the basket. On the return trip he will roll the hula hoop back to the next player on his team. Play continues until all of the cards have been chosen. Each player will probably have more than one turn. When he completes his turn, he should go to the end of his team line and wait to roll again.

Say, "Roll 'em" to begin the game.

Once all the cards have been gathered, congratulate the team who completed the relay first.

Say: "The cards you gathered are the names of the books of the Old Testament. Does anyone know how many books are in the Old Testament?" (39). Tell the kids that the second part of the relay will be for their team to arrange the cards on the floor in order. The team who completes it first and correctly will be declared the winner. Say, "Roll 'em" to begin the competition. Start the stopwatch.

When a team indicates it has finished, note the time on the watch. Tell the team to use their Bibles or the "Books of the Bible Poster" to check their work. Allow the other team to complete its work. Note the time, and tell them to check their work. Congratulate both teams.

Lead the group to read the names of the Old Testament books from the cards they arranged on the floor.

If time permits, play the hula hoop relay again. This time allow the team members who are waiting for a turn to begin putting the books in order during the relay.

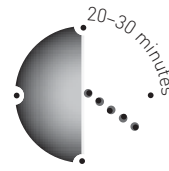
Set up the room again for the next group.

Old Testament Book Relay

- Arrange the area to provide space for a relay and for the Old Testament book cards to be displayed on the floor in order.
- Provide:
 - two sets of Old Testament "Books of the Bible Cards" (Item 3)
 - two baskets
 - two hula hoops
 - a stopwatch or a watch with a second hand.
- Display "Books of the Bible Poster" (Item 11).

Teaching Tip: If another Skill Option group is using the "Books of the Bible Poster," display a copy of the "Books of the Bible" on page 77 of the activity book.

Crafts



Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills Folder

- Provide:
 - a bright colored, two-pocket, portfolio-type folder with fasteners for each child.
 - an assortment of art supplies such as glitter pens, markers, and stickers.

Key Rings and Covers

- Provide
 - three key rings for each child.
 - an assortment of felt pieces, scissors, and glue.
- Cut three 2½-by-3½-inch felt pieces for each child. Punch a hole in the upper right corner of each piece to insert the key ring.

Teaching Tip: Remember that this activity has to be one the children can complete in 10 minutes.

Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills Folder

Tell the kids that they will personalize and decorate a folder in which to keep all their “Skill Check Lists.”

Allow each child to choose a colored folder and use the pens, stickers, and markers to decorate and personalize one. Encourage the parents to help the children. Give these suggestions:

- Write your name on the folder.
- Write Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills on the folder.

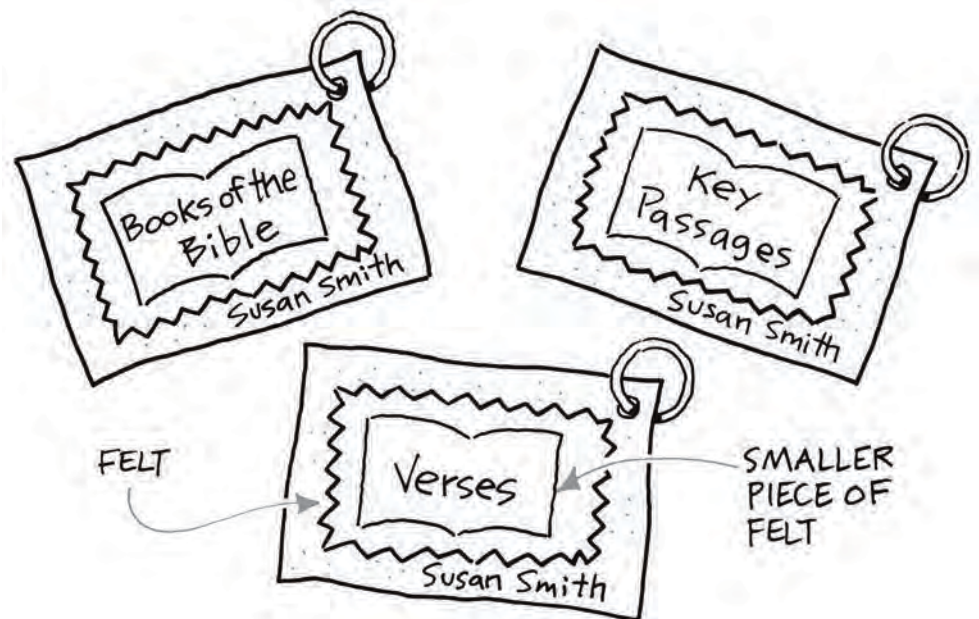
Remind the children that they will place their “Skill Check Lists” in the folder each week.

Key Rings and Covers

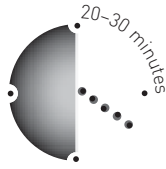
Explain that the children will be given three sets of flash card type study materials to help them learn the books of the Bible, the Bible verses, and the Key Passages. Say, “These cards are made to fit on a key ring.” Tell the kids that they will personalize and decorate a cover for each of their key rings.

Give each child three key rings and three pieces of felt you have already cut to size. Tell them to use the smaller pieces of felt to decorate the felt covers.

Remind the children that they will need to bring these key rings to each meeting because they will add to them each week.



Service



Neighborhood Door Hanger Blitz

Ask the boys and girls (and parents) if they know of children in their neighborhoods who might like to be in Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills. Give each family group a pencil and a sheet of paper and ask them to list three homes where they could leave a door hanger promoting Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills. If additional names are needed, offer the list of prospects you gathered from the Sunday School rolls.

Give each family group markers and three of the door hangers you have printed. Allow time for them to fill in the blanks on each hanger. Call attention to the sample door hanger you have displayed in order to assure that the spelling and times are correct.

As the group works, guide discussion by asking these questions:

- “Why do you think it is important to come to Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills?”
- “Tell us one thing you learned about the Bible in Group Skills time.”

Remind the boys and girls that not everyone knows the importance of Bible study. This simple service project can be a reminder to some families in your neighborhood of the opportunity they have to join you for Bible, Skills, Drills, & Thrills.

Suggest that the door hangers be hung on the front door of the home early in the week without knocking or ringing the doorbell. Sometime the next day, telephone each home where you left a door hanger.

Ask:

- “Did you find the door hanger I left on your front door?”
- “Do you have any questions about Bible Skills, Drills, & Thrills?”
- “Would you be interested in attending our next meeting?”
- “Could we stop by and pick you up?”

Allow each family group to share the three homes where they plan to leave door hangers. If there are duplications, offer a different prospect’s name.

Neighborhood Door Hanger Blitz

- Print enough copies of the “Neighborhood Door Hangers” (Item 9) for each child to have three.
- Gather a list of children’s ministry prospects’ names, addresses, and phone numbers.
- Provide paper, markers, pencils, and scissors.

Teaching Tip: Display one of the door hangers that you have completed with the name of your church and the meeting times.

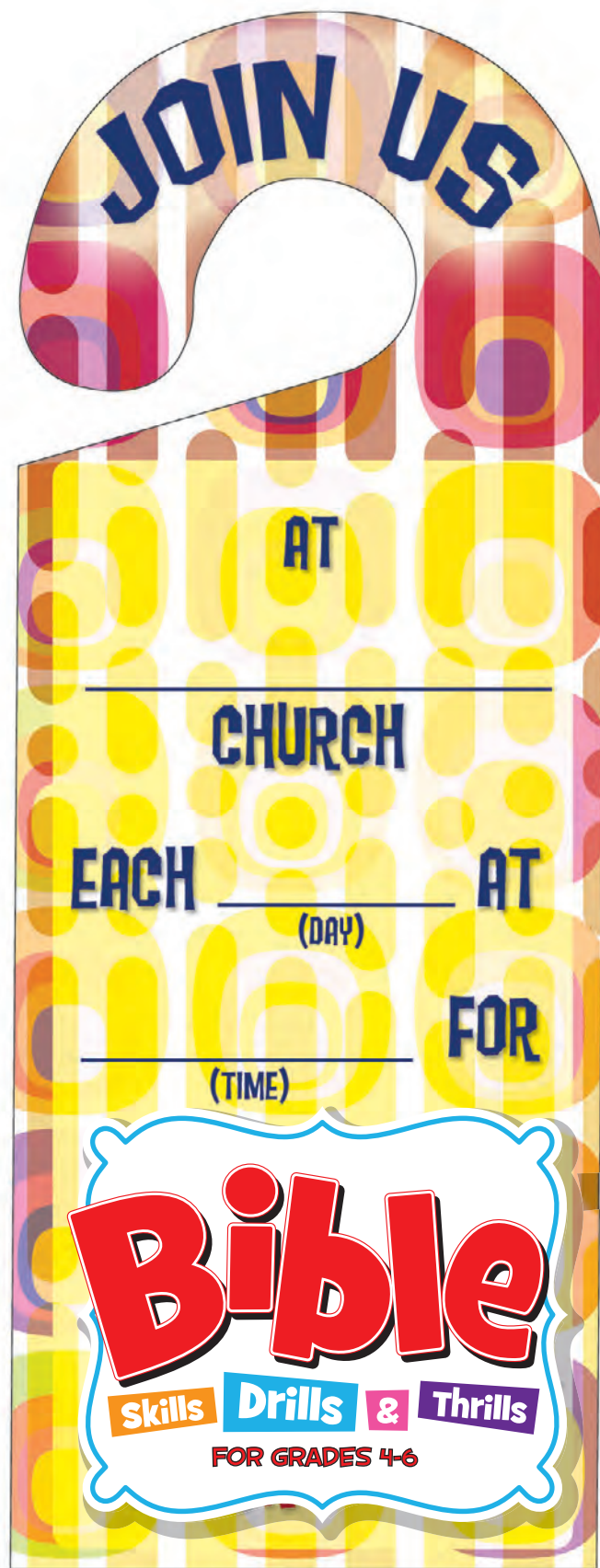

What Are the Drill Commands?



Attention

Stand straight, one foot not extended in front of the other, eyes focused on the caller until the command "Start" is given. Hold your Bible at your side (in either hand) with the Bible's spine down.

Present Bibles

This call is used only in the Book Calls and Key Passage Calls. Bring your Bible to waistline, parallel with the floor. Following the "Present Bible" command, the caller announces the call.

If you search with your right hand, hold the Bible in your left hand with Genesis down and with the right hand resting flat on the back of the Bible and no fingers extending over the edges.

If you search with your left hand, hold the Bible in your right hand, Genesis up, with the left hand resting flat on the front of your Bible and no fingers extending over the edges.



Start



This command is the signal for you to step forward or begin searching in your Bibles. For the Book Call and Key Passage Call, begin searching in the Bible when the command is given. It is a mistake to begin before this command is given. In the Book Call, the index finger must be placed upon any part of that book.

In the Key Passage Call, find any part of the reference, place your index finger on any portion, and step forward.

For the Quotation or Completion Calls, step forward when you can say the verse.

Time

The timekeeper calls out "Time" at the end of 10 seconds. No one may step forward after this command, and all children should stop searching in their Bibles.

The caller calls on one child by number who will give a response.

The other children will remain quiet while the one called on responds.

If the child called on does not give the right response, the caller calls on another child.



Attention

Close the Bible, return it to its original position, and take one step back.
