WEEK 1: PAST: LOOKING BACK, LOOKING FORWARD

- We don't fall in love with Him because we know the story of His life; we fall in love with Him when we realize our names are written in the gaps of white between the print.

WEEK 2: PREFACE: THE EARLY YEARS

- Now imagine Mary—beautiful, young, devout Mary—her eyes shining and heart pounding as her Son reminded her that while she raised Him, He is also someone else's Son.

WEEK 3: PRESENCE: STARTING HIS MINISTRY

- He wasn't a far-off God who barked orders; He was a confidante, friend, teacher, and compassionate man who people knew they could always come to when they were confused or walking through grief.
- God knows you aren't perfect; He doesn't keep you at arm's length in the moments you feel like you're failing.
- Jesus isn't demanding; He's inviting.

WEEK 4: PURPOSE: THE TEACHER

- Jesus didn't *just* come to the world to die for us; He came to live with us.
- Knowledge is useless unless it is put into action.
- It's not about the answers; it's about the heart. It isn't keeping the Law out of obligation that matters—it's obedience that pours from a true love of Christ.

- Are you serving the world so much that you've forgotten to serve God?
- Jesus knows the end of the story, but He grieves with us in the meantime.

WEEK 6: PASSION: THE SUFFERING SAVIOR

- And they never knew that as the soldiers pressed the thorns deeper into His human flesh, they are actually crowning the true King.
- He atoned for our sins, not just temporarily but permanently.
- We are covered by Jesus' blood, forgiven by His mercy, and loved by His grace.

WEEK 7: PROMISE: THE RISEN LORD

- Jesus refuses to stop loving us even when we don't know how to love Him in return.
- Before Jesus returned to His Father, He promised His disciples (including us) that He would always be here—that He will never leave us for a single moment.
- Our repentance isn't based on us getting all the words right or recounting every single sin we've committed; it's the recognition that when we turn to Jesus, He does what He does best: forgive..

WEEK 8: PERSONAL: A CHOICE TO MAKE

- You are not responsible for being anything more than what I am: a daughter who wants to be with her Father.
- Jesus never told us that if we don't love Him perfectly, we must not love Him at all.
- We can spend our lives complicating God and criticizing things we aren't sure we agree with, but this truth will remain regardless: what He desires is our imperfect, questioning, broken, seeking, confused, and desperate hearts.
